The importance of role models

Adults play a crucial role by modelling good behaviour in front of children.

This includes talking and questioning, at the beginning and end of the day, when children are dropped off or collected.

It makes sense to talk positively in front of children as much as possible to encourage their own positive behaviour.

Therefore, we would ask all parents to help us make the most of this learning opportunity and en-

courage you to clearly demonstrate your own positive speaking and listening skills. This could include introducing yourself to a fellow parent who you have not talked to before, or smiling and saying good morning to a complete stranger.

This way your child will gain a clearer understanding of what good manners and positive behaviour are.

This will encourage them to copy and learn these important speaking and listening skills, crucial to a successful start in life.

School Meals:

If your child wishes to stop or start school meals then you are required to give one week's notice in writing. If you pay for your child's meal(s) you should pay in advance and not in arrears. Dinners currently cost £1.90 but from September this will increase to £2. If you need further information please contact Lorraine or Julie in the Primary Office.
